Carl Lokko, MSW, RSW, C.Ht London, Ontario

Carl Lokko was educated at the University of Ghana, Wilfred Laurier University, and at Florida State University. He has been practicing as a Clinical Social Worker for the past 25 years, focusing on individual, groups and family counselling and psychotherapy. He has extensive experience in the field of community-based brain injury rehabilitation and chronic pain management following motor vehicle accidents. He practices hypnotherapy, and is a Board member of the Canadian Society of Clinical Hypnosis – Ontario Division. Carl's private practice is located in London, Ontario. In addition to serving clients at his office in London, Ontario, Carl does house calls across Southwestern Ontario. He enjoys reading, sports, solving puzzles, comedy, a wide range of music, and spirituality.

Dr. Sandeep Hunjan, Ph.D., C. Psych

Dr. Hunjan is a clinical psychologist who earned her Ph.D. from the University of Windsor. Her practice includes clinical, counselling, rehabilitation and health psychology. She has worked extensively in the area of trauma (with survivors of sexual and physical assault, motor vehicle accidents, workplace injuries and disease, and veterans) in a variety of settings in Canada and the United States. Her philosophy of practice is holistic and client-centred. Dr. Hunjan emphasizes an integrative and collaborative approach using treatment modalities including hypnosis, cognitive behavioural therapy, and energy psychology to help individuals, families, and groups deal with a variety of issues such as depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress, weight loss, pain, smoking cessation, performance enhancement, self-esteem and stress management. In her teaching activities, Dr. Hunjan has worked with St. John's Rehab Hospital, the Toronto Police Department, and the Vulva Girl (a support group for women who experience sexual pain). Following almost five years as a psychologist with St. John's Rehab Hospital's Back on Track Serious Injuries Clinic, Dr. Hunjan has been in full-time private practice for the past sixteen years. She uses hypnosis extensively in her practice, and loves how it helps and empowers her clients.

Allen Rodgers, B.Sc, MD, BFA

Allen Rodgers graduated from Dalhousie University Medical School in 1978 after completing his Bachelor of Science there in 1974. He then went on to complete a Bachelor of Fine Arts at York University in 1981. His first training in hypnosis was in the early '90s with the Ontario Society of Clinical Hypnosis (which later evolved into CSCH-OD). After over 40 years of practice he recently retired from Emergency Medicine (he has worked in Peterborough, ON since 1988).

In addition to his ER practice he began working as a Cardiology Associate in 1998; it was in this context that his hypnosis training began to be more frequently employed. He was seeing patients with life changing cardiac events and their need for both medical and psychological support began to reorient his practice to doing more and more psychotherapy. Now he frequently uses hypnosis in managing the anxiety associated with traumatizing medical events, finding it so useful in reframing, ego strengthening, and making available to the patient the realm of healing themselves.

Dr. Arpita Biswas, Ph.D., C.Psych.

Dr. Arpita Biswas is a registered psychologist and seasoned clinician with nearly 35 years of clinical experience. She is passionate about holistic, client-centred care, and has effectively integrated hypnosis into her practice to address a diverse range of challenges—from anxiety, depression, trauma, insomnia, and relationship issues to various medical concerns.

Recognizing the transformative potential of focused attention, she has long relied on hypnosis to help clients tap into their innate strengths and resources.

She is an active member of the Canadian Society of Clinical Hypnosis – Ontario Division since 2008 and is currently the President of the organization.
